Dear Parents & Carers,

As we enter this week of the second National Lockdown, I would like to thank you all for your continued support and appreciation of the work we are doing here at Ss. Peter and Paul to ensure your child's safety. The new lockdown measures will apply nationally for four weeks until Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> December. At the end of this period we understand the Government will look to reintroduce the regional tier based system. You can find a full list of the restrictions and [more details on the government website](#).

With regards to childcare and support bubbles, the Government has stated so far, that parents are still able to form a childcare bubble with another household for the purposes of informal childcare, where the child is 13 or under. Children can move between homes if their parents are separated. Support bubbles are also still allowed. Households in that support bubble can still visit each other, stay overnight, and visit outdoor public places together.

We ask that you please continue to support us by following guidelines. We need your continued support too at drop off and home times as these are the trickiest parts of the day. The community patrol will continue to visit so please drive sensibly, park thoughtfully and help keep children and all other road users safe. We want to be as supportive as we can to our families at this difficult time and so ask that you please remember to bring your child into school at the time set for their class or at time agreed with school. Thank you for wearing face masks. We do understand some of you are exempt from this so encourage you to maintain appropriate social distancing.

### Contact Details

We notice that on occasions we are unable to contact a family. In the interest of your child's safety and wellbeing we need up to date contact details for a named adult who can be contacted at all times. If you recently changed your details, please let school know so that we can update our records.

### Remembrance Day

On Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> we will stop at 11 am to remember all the people who have died. Please pause for a moment at this time if you are able to. The children will be engaged in a variety of activities to support them to reflect on the meaning of the day.

### Children in Need

On Friday 13<sup>th</sup>, we will once again support Children in Need. Children can come to school either in their own clothes or in something spotty if you already have something suitable. Please don't go out to the shops to buy anything new at this time. A small donation to Children in Need appeal would be appreciated.


### Deputy Headteacher Update


